ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS: This is a professional position providing assistance to the Grand Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve (GBNERR). This position will include responsibilities relating to the Education Program at the Reserve including implementation of the 'On the Road' education program; assisting with the K-12 and community education activities; aiding in the execution of teacher workshops; integrating with team members from other sectors (Research, Stewardship) to help identify education needs; creating new curriculum/lessons to be implemented both onsite and offsite; provide assistance to the Coastal Training Program (CTP) as needed; aid in field assistance on occasion; conducting kayak tours and maintaining the kayaks; plus a variety of other tasks as needed. Activities will be closely coordinated with the GBNERR, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and other partners, consistent with the goals and objectives of the Reserve, Mississippi Department of Marine Resources (MDMR), and NOAA. This position will be directly supervised by the Education Coordinator.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES: The ideal candidate will have: a science background and excellent communication, interpersonal, and outreach skills; have some experience in a formal or informal education setting; be able to write and adapt educational curriculum; possess interpretation and facilitation skills; be an organized self-starter capable of following detailed instructions effectively; a working knowledge of coastal ecosystems and Mississippi flora and fauna (preferred); always putting safety first for both the employee and the program participants; operating motor vehicles, boats and other electronic equipment in an efficient, safe and responsible manner, as needed; working knowledge of the Grand Bay NERR Management Plan; and, proficiency with basic software packages, including MS Office, Adobe Creative Suite, and social networking websites. The ideal candidate should have some basic familiarity with the National Estuarine Research Reserve System. The ideal candidate will possess excellent organizational skills, be creative and motivated, and able to implement multiple project tasks simultaneously. Skills in outreach, writing, field work, and kayaking are also desired. Applicant must possess a valid driver license and be able to lift at least 25 lbs., and up to 40 lbs., on occasion. Information technology skills should include proficiency in word processing, data entry and management. A portion of the work will occur outside, often under extreme weather conditions, including extremes of heat, cold, wind and rain.
