In #OurEstuary, it includes habitats like forested wetlands, freshwater swamps, and saltwater marshes. It's what makes the Barataria and Terrebonne basins the most diverse ecosystem in the world — a habitat that gives the gifts of blue crabs, brown shrimp, salty oysters, and world-class fishing. Claude and Clawdette's Estuary Adventure




- Pre-K to 5th grade





